Larry Richardson shared the success of the Well City initiative. Two more employers have earned the Well Workplace Designation for a total of nine employers to date. Community Forum	The Community Forum will be held Thursday, April 30 <sup>th</sup> at 7 – 8 am at Agnesian HealthCare Plaza Level Conference Center. The general public is the target group for the Forum. Kim Mueller reported that there are about 30 RSVPs so far. She will resend the invitation and the link to the Living Well website to the coalition members for dissemination via Twitter, etc. Heather Schmidt reported that the Forum’s Welcome will be delivered by one of the Well City Designations, Chamber director Rick Parks. Heather Schmidt will speak about the 4 priorities and offer attendees the opportunity to get involved. Summary Reports	<b>Alcohol Use/Abuse:</b> Bill Lamb reported that the Alcohol & Drug Court currently has 8 in court. Compliance checks started strong but have tapered off stating resources and the Wisconsin culture as being factors. OWI Saturation	Informative	None	None

	<p>Patrols are going fairly well. Community Event Best Practices guides are being used by municipal clerks when issuing temporary licenses. The Drug Drop box is being used way beyond its capacity. The DEA has strict rules but additional ways to collect unused medications are needed.</p> <p><b>Dental Care Access:</b> Kim Mueller reported that the Mission of Mercy providing free dental care will be held June 12-13, 2015. The email asking for volunteers will be resent. Due to leftover 2014 funding from Agnesian, the Adult dental program is expanding the eligibility/funding guidelines to reach more adults with emergent needs. With Agnesian's permission, a small group of eligible adults will be seen on a trial basis to test the changes and assess the need.</p> <p><b>Mental Health Access:</b> Matt Doll stated that measurable outcomes have been identified and tied to evidence based links but all need to recognize that it is difficult to show progress. Insurance issues are part of larger systemic problems. The Mobile Crisis grant applied for by the Police Dept. would be a significant step to get suicidal people help and address mental health issues earlier. Bill Lamb extended his thanks to Erin Gerrad and Allen Buechel for their support with the grant. Applications for the Mental Health Coordinator have been received and interviews will begin soon.</p> <p><b>Living Well Group:</b> Heather Schmidt reported Living Well is working with UW Extension on goals and objectives re: obesity rates, increasing vegetable intake, encouraging nutrition label reading and physical activity. Also involved in the Community Garden initiative. Have partnered with Agnesian and Aurora to work on a toolkit for providers to be released in early 2016. A grant was received from the WI Cancer Coalition to enroll obese women with 0-3 stage breast cancer in a fruit and vegetable RX program. Also working to expand program to the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade in other school districts. Have also received a Quality of Life mini grant.</p>			
Other Business	<p>Upcoming events: Color Burst 5K this Saturday April 25<sup>th</sup>. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Heroin Summit will be held on Wednesday April 29<sup>th</sup>. Marion Sheridan stated that the target audience for this is the parents of middle and high school students. Bill Lamb stated that the heroin problem is beyond epidemic proportions in FDL and a necessary event for citizens. Marian Sheridan reported that Mental Health First Aid trainings will be held, 3 are scheduled to date. The FDL County training is scheduled for May 14<sup>th</sup> and openings are still available.</p>	Informative	None	None
