Awareness Task Force Update	Kim reported that a meeting was held in December 8. Discussion to roll out the Healthy 2020 brochure for 2015-2018 to be used when doing presentations and going to clubs, etc. but what else could be done to raise awareness? Heather Schmidt explained the concept of Photovoice. The goal is to give the community a voice and to see through their eyes by recording the community's strengths and weaknesses. Cameras would be given to focus groups and each Healthy FDL 2020 priority group. They have applied for a \$2500 grant to help with the purchase of 20 cameras and the printing costs. Summary Reports	Alcohol and Drug Abuse – Bill Lamb reported that the Best Practices guide has been pushed out for community functions and is doing well. The Police Department received money through an OWI grant to fund more deployments and OWI arrests have decreased due to enforcement and education. The Opioid 4 Pillars group continue to work in their respective areas. Bill is pursuing more funding for a Coordinator position for the 4 Pillars group. 2015 numbers show Heroin/opioid use is down 35%. Also, the use of Narcan is down by 30% in both the Police and Fire Departments. Progress has been	Informative	None	None

	<p>made but a lot of work still needs to be done. Dental Care Access: Kim Mueller reported that the kid's piece of the Save a Smile Program has applied for a \$50,000 grant and has received a \$7500 grant from the FDL Area Foundation. The waiting list is at about 300 kids but they are working on getting more enrolled and off the list. Give Kids A Smile day is scheduled and they are enlisting more dentists to participate. The Adult piece is soon to get the last portion of the \$400,000 donation from Agnesian. ER visits for repeat dental care has decreased from 11% to 2.3%. Mental Health Access: Gregg Brewer reported that 2 people were hired and are working in the CSI positions. Many things in progress: The Suicide Prevention Task Force is offering training and a suicide screening tool to Mental Health clinicians, Police Dept. and teachers. Working with the Wisconsin Trauma Project to educate and assist agencies in training professionals and parents to become trauma informed to identify the needs of children and families. Pursing a grant to support Mobile Crisis, also involved in Crisis Intervention Training for the Police Dept. Living Well Group: Heather Schmidt reported that the resource toolkits are being distributed to primary care providers and Cancer care clinics. FONDY5210 program is going well. Fruit/Vegetable RX program has 20 patients enrolled. Community Garden initiative is going well and looking into purchasing Parrot Palms for the commercial kitchen it would provide. The local Farmer's Market will be promoting a "Healthy Living Saturday" one time per month and will offer educational opportunities and coaching to facilitate communication. Agnesian is starting a local "Walk with the Doc", a nationwide program but the first in Wisconsin. It begins on Thursday Feb. 4 at 8:30 at the Forest Mall and continues every Thursday.</p>
