Awareness Task Force Update	Heather Schmidt reported on the progress of the Photovoice project to raise awareness. The obesity priority group have taken their photos and have passed on the cameras to drug and alcohol group with the dental group next on the list. Last year, with the help of UW Population Health, a team representative of the 4 priority groups began short term community health coaching. At present they are pursuing a long term health coaching opportunity and finding a goal for successful collaboration and to have the most collective impact. ACEs and trauma-informed care will be the focus using CSI's presentation of the documentary "Resilience" to gain insight on this huge issue. The groups working together can make a bigger impact and promote better understanding for themselves and community members.	Informative	None	None
Community Health Assessment 2017	Kim Mueller informed all the CHA 2017 process is starting with an Ad Hoc meeting on Feb. 22. They will discuss and narrow down the questions to be asked while still having the ability to compare them with the last CHA done 3 years ago. Standard questions will be used along with those of interest to our county such as mental health access/stigma. The calls will begin in the fall of 2017 with all of the data compiled by the end of the year.	Informative	None	None
Summary Reports	Alcohol and Drug Abuse – The Cities of FDL and Ripon have completed their compliance checks and a report will be available Feb. 15 th . Festival evaluations are complete and meetings with organizers and law enforcement have been held. The Harm Reduction Pillar has scheduled 3 Narcan trainings for 2017: January 14 th , May 16 th and August 19 th . The Social Host ordinance was struck down in the Appeals court in October and DFC is waiting to see	Informative	None	None

	<p>if a legislative solution is forthcoming. Dental Care Access: Kim Mueller reported that the Save a Smile Program enrolled 58 new kids this quarter bringing enrollment to 904. Most were referrals from community partners with urgent dental needs. Because urgent needs are the enrollment priority, the SAS waitlist has not decreased as was planned for this year. The annual “Give Kids a Smile Day” will be held in February with SAS hosting. The SAS Adult program is going smoothly with 403 adults referred for urgent dental treatment in 2016. SAS received 175 ER referrals via fax. Presentations to the community and education about the SAS program continues. Mental Health Access: Marian Sheridan reported in Jim Salasek’s absence that the group’s focus at present is to develop a survey of behavioral health providers in both mental health and substance abuse, to determine what resources are available in the county and gather valuable data for future goals. Members will be working with Mental Health America/Prevent Suicide Wisconsin to host a Wisconsin Zero Suicide training in FDL in June 2017. Sandi Roehrig suggested creating a presentation to business owners to educate that community on trauma impact and suicide prevention. Agnesian continues their recruitment of mental health professionals with a new person starting in Ripon. Living Well Group: Heather Schmidt reported that the Farmer’s Market had 2100 attendees this year. The FDL Loop/City of FDL received an honorable mention award for being a bicycle friendly community. The coalition will assist to increase this ranking with support for bike to school and work events and biking awareness in 2017. Cardiac Rehab 3 program at the YMCA in partnership with Agnesian HC is doing well with 21 patients referred to the program. The Living Well FDL Coalition’s sustainability will be the 2017 focus and to secure long term funding for the staff coordinator position that will end in July 2017. This is a big step backwards for the group and any ideas for future funding would be appreciated.</p>
