Awareness Task Force Update	Heather Schmidt reported on the progress of the Photovoice project. Interns Taylor and Chelsea are working with Kya and the Boys and Girls Club to reorder the cameras. They decided to order just 10 cameras of better quality at \$100 each. After the research and purchase process is complete, they will get started. The cameras will be rotated between the focus groups and each Healthy FDL 2020 priority group to record the community’s strengths and weaknesses in photos. Summary Reports	Alcohol and Drug Abuse – Bill Lamb reported that the Opioid 4 Pillar groups met recently. Two Drug Drop boxes have been added at St Agnes and Waupun Hospitals and are filling up fast. Katherine Vergos added that St. Agnes Hospice is starting a program to collect and dispose of their patient’s unused opioid medications as well. Alcohol compliance checks continue but a 20-25 % failure rate is still being seen. Will be doing retailer training in the fall. Working on issues with wrist banding at community events as well. Dental Care Access: Kim Mueller reported that the Save a Smile Program has enrolled 228 kids with urgent needs but there are still 400 on the waiting	Informative	None	None

	<p>list. There has been a big increase in referrals from the FDL School District. An education program at Headstart will be implemented in September. In the Adult SAS piece, Agnesian has approved continuing funding based largely on decreased ER visits. SAS dispersed updated ER referral forms to emergency departments at Auror, St. Agnes, Agnesian in Ripon and Waupun. Mental Health Access: Jim Salasek reported that a conference is coming up on Oct. 13th at Marian University. A \$10,000 grant will bring in a national speaker and sponsor a community wide campaign to educate all on suicide and suicide prevention. The keynote speaker will address the public and professionals on the 0% suicide and trauma informed care initiatives. The goal is to develop a network that shares a common philosophy on how to deal with suicide and to adopt an evidence based long term treatment plan across the board.</p> <p>Living Well Group: Heather Schmidt reported that The Downtown Farmer's Market is using videos for marketing/advertising done in English, Spanish and Hmong. Vouchers totaling \$500 for use at the Farmer's Market are being distributed to various groups. The YMCA is offering "Family Bicycle Safety 101" to promote using the Fond du Lac Loop. Long term health coaching opportunities are available through UW-Extension.</p>			
Funding Updates (New Initiatives)	<p>Bill Lamb stated that he and Marian Sheridan are seeking funding and grant opportunities to be able to hire more staff for the Drug Free initiative. Sandi Roehrig suggested making a YouTube video presentation that would feature the summary reports to take to the Board and to get the message out there. Kim Mueller said that she has hired a fulltime Health Educator that may be able to assist in that venture. Shelley Tidemann stated that the UW-Extension is working with someone on video/digital editing if training is needed to help with the making of a YouTube video. Jim Salasek pointed out that we need local media to carve out a place on a monthly basis to educate the community on our efforts.</p>	Informative	None	None
