Awareness Task Force Update	Heather Schmidt reported that the Photovoice project to raise awareness is stalled at present. The obesity priority group have taken their photos and have passed on the cameras to the drug and alcohol group who has it now. The health coaching collaboration with CSI focusing on trauma-informed care (TIC), is making headway. Goals and objectives have been identified and the group is getting ready to reach out to other agencies to utilize TIC and apply for grants and other funding opportunities. Sandi Roehrig commented on how trauma impacts all of the 4 pillars and suggested more community education be done and also add language to the Healthy FDL 2020 brochure showing how TIC relates to everything. Community Health Assessment 2017	Kim Mueller stated that she will be sending out a press release shortly (8/7/17) informing the public about the phone calls going out 8/10/17 to collect information for the 2017 Community Health Assessment. They expect to have finished the analysis and have the results by November and present them to the community in the spring of 2018. Summary Reports	<p>Alcohol and Drug Abuse: <i>Please see the attached 2nd Quarter Summary report.</i> Kim Mueller added that all of the groups were working on new goals and objectives. The Harm Reduction group continues to successfully utilize the Vivitrol program targeting people in the jail to stop their opioid addiction through medication and counseling. The group is also exploring a wraparound jail reduction discharge program to identify gaps in services needed upon release from the jail. See the link to view the successful program being used in MN. https://vimeo.com/13189407</p> <p>Narcan community trainings continue to be offered 3-4 times annually as needed with kits distributed to those interested. The next one is on August 19th at St. Paul's Cathedral in FDL. The City PD will begin carrying nasal Narcan kits in their squads as soon as training is complete.
