Mission Moment	Marian Sheridan acknowledged Jim Salasek for the great job done on leading the recent conference on trauma-informed suicide prevention. It was well attended and a great success. Greg Giles mentioned that the FDL Area YMCA, in partnership with Agnesian Healthcare physicians, has received 50-60 referrals to their healthy living programs. As a result, 225 people have been enrolled since March making a collective impact for the better health of the community.	Informative	None	None

Awareness Task Force Update	Heather Schmidt reported on the progress of the Photovoice project to raise awareness. The Boys and Girls Club have taken 65 useable photos and meet again on Nov. 1 <sup>st</sup> . They are well on their way to gathering the data needed for the photo presentation to the community. Summary Reports	<b>Alcohol and Drug Abuse</b> – Marian Sheridan reported in Bill Lamb’s absence that the Drug Free Communities of FDL County is making good progress. Agnesian HC is hosting a professional workshop on Nov. 3 <sup>rd</sup> for area providers on correct prescribing of opioids and to introduce changes to the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program. Heroin addicted jail inmates will be offered treatment in a program to begin soon. The Drug Drop boxes are being well used and alcohol compliance checks by law enforcement continues. <b>Dental Care Access:</b> Sam Twohig reported that the Save a Smile Program has been busy this quarter enrolling an additional 88 kids with urgent needs increasing enrollment to 941. A recent meeting was held with the FDL school district in order to streamline the referral process to the SAS program. Health Fairs and other resources are being utilized to increase public awareness. The Adult SAS piece is moving forward. 288 adults have been referred, with 133 ER referrals this year. The ER referral form has been streamlined and is working well. <b>Mental Health Access:</b> Jim Salasek reported that the group is taking the existing plan and will develop more realistic goals that align better with CSI to reach achievable short term goals. 	<p>A suicide prevention committee plans to partner with the media to educate the community. Jim reiterated that the conference was very successful and focused on trauma informed care and it's link to suicide prevention. Focus needs to be on access to services, especially for children, and recruitment of providers. Looking at provider surveys to get an idea of barriers to seeking out mental health services and how to deal with them. The group plans to aggressively seek more community partners in an effort to get things done. Heather Schmidt, DO stated that she is doing depression screening and is involved in a pilot program to develop treatment protocols and recommendations. <b>Living Well Group:</b> Heather Schmidt reported that they are continuing to work on advertising the Farmer's Market. Many people are utilizing FoodShare benefits at the Market. Intern, Doniell Erickson has completed assessments of local food retailers that will give the group data to help obtain grants and determine strategies in creating a healthier food environment. Working on obtaining use of materials of a national marketing campaign, FNV (fruits and vegetables) to run a program in our community. The Y5210 program is not expected to increase but will remain in about 25 classrooms for now.</p>

#### **Summary to be read at meeting:**

1. 88 additional children have been enrolled in Save a Smile this quarter, bringing the current enrollment to 941 . The majority of these were referrals from community partners with urgent dental needs. Children needing urgent dental care are an enrollment priority , therefore the SAS Wait List has not decreased as we had planned. Kim Mueller and I met with 2 school nurses in September to discuss improving the referral process from the school-based dental hygiene program, due to the significant increase in referrals from the schools at the end of the 2015-16 school-year .

2. Save a Smile participated in several area Health/Resource Fairs to increase the public's awareness of services available. (Ex. Back to School FDL Resource Fair- w/ Boys and Girls Club, the Answers Team Resource Fair- w/ The Salvation Army and the FDL County Employee Health Fair). 288 adults have been referred through SAS this year.

3. We have received via fax 133 ER referrals this year.

**1. Farmers Market token** use up from 2015. Year to Date over \$8000 in credit/debit/foodshare transactions have occurred with \$3500 of that being Foodshare transactions. **2. Intern for 2016** - Doniell Erickson - Food Retail Environment Scan. Doniell is a senior at Lawrence University pursuing a degree in Biological Anthropology. She has been working with the coalition during summer 2016 assessing the food retail environment. This work will give the coalition baseline data which will be helpful in obtaining state grants and determining strategies in creating a healthier food environment. **3. Photovoice** - Boys & Girls Club implemented the obesity piece of the project in September. Photos are currently being reviewed and cameras will be moving on to the next priority area over the next month. **4. Y5210 kits** distributed to 30 classrooms for the 2016-17 school year.
