<b>Update from Health Priority Working Groups Alcohol Use and Abuse</b>	Bill Lamb reported work group is exploring idea of merging with Drug-free communities. Doesn't anticipate any problems with this. Drug court will need to be addressed at a local level. A grant is available regarding drug court (deadline is Feb 1 <sup>st</sup> per Erin Gerred). A meeting is being held to discuss applying for the grant. Keg registration group is moving slow but steady due to it being a county wide need.	Continuing implementation	Bill Lamb
<b>Dental Access</b>	Samantha Twohig discussed Save-a-Smile expansion into adult population to treat emergent needs at this time. Save-a-Smile is working with Agnesian to help fund emergent needs of adults. February 5 area dentists are meeting to discuss moving forward with the adult population. Sam outreached to one daycare center called Playhouse 4 the Precious. This daycare was on board to work with Save-a-Smile to increase fluoride varnishes and dental sealants. Sam will continue to work on a process to get this started. Outreach was made in the form of a letter sent to communities with below recommended levels of fluoridation in the water. Health Department is working with Smiles 4 Life to expand varnishes and dental sealants. Smiles 4 Life is making referrals to Save a Smile and plans to expand to more schools and grades next school year.	Continuing implementation	Kim Mueller

<b>Mental Health</b>	Greg Brewer discussed draft website content is being reviewed. Trauma-informed care programs are being offered. The 2 <sup>nd</sup> in a series of 3 was held on 1/11/13 and SPROUT is sponsoring this. Dr. Matt Doll is working with this group to present ACE (Adverse Childhood Experiences), which assists the healthcare providers to identify and address factors that correlate with MH issues. Agnesian ER, law enforcement, and DCP will be meeting to discuss issues related to emergency detentions. Educational programs such as Community Trauma Team to employers, insurance companies, and brokers for late Spring in progress.	Continuing implementation	Greg Brewer
<b>Obesity and Overweight</b>	Steve Little reported that, with collaboration between Marian Sheridan, Derek Toshner, Steve Little, and Greg Giles, a coordinator, Kya Schnettler, was hired and will be starting January 28 <sup>th</sup> . She will work under the direction of the YMCA and Agnesian is funding her salary/benefits. It will be Kya's job to seek out funding opportunities for program growth. Greg Giles added that a meeting on January 30 will occur and will include many different groups in the Fond du Lac area coming together to work on wellness/obesity issues. Giles added they purchased a mobile van with help from the Fond du Lac Area Foundation to increase awareness and education and discussion expansion of Y5201 program.
