<b>Living Well FDL Website</b>	Monthly fee for the website is \$20/month. Any donation, even for a month or two, is very helpful. The plan is for the Website to go live on July 1 <sup>st</sup> 2013. Each group is represented on the website group and meeting consistently to discuss the website details. Training on how to post blogs, calendar events, etc. is now completed. <p><b>Update from Health Priority Working Groups: Alcohol Use and Abuse</b></p>	<p>Marian Sheridan reported: drug drop was successful, looking at ways people are prescribing actual medications, more education on what meds do to people. Working on creating new drug drop in North Fond du Lac. Working hard on county fair, best practices on preventing alcohol/drug abuse and on access to alcohol/drug by minors. No word yet on drug court grant. A group is meeting today to discuss various options. Fond du Lac School District will continue to be administrator but there is a lack in funding at this time.</p>	<p>Continuing implementation</p>	<p>Bill Lamb</p>
<p><b>Dental Access</b></p>	<p>Kim Mueller reported: dental program has just started outreach into the daycare setting. First daycare was yesterday at Playhouse for the Precious in Fond du Lac and it was successful. Currently in the process of working on hiring a Limited-term Part-time Dental Hygienist to help increase outreach in the adult population. This position was made possible with the funding from Agnesian. Position is awaiting approval of the County Board in July.</p>	<p>Continuing implementation</p>	<p>Kim Mueller</p>
<p><b>Mental Health</b></p>	<p>Matt Doll reported: Holly Brenner put together a template of information specifically on stigma and created a fact sheet. SPROUT has workshops on trauma informed care. Regarding a wellness initiative, they are working on a mental health screening tool to be more widely in communities. A presentation from Dr. Brown was very informative and focused on motivational interviewing. This screening initiative is focused on alcohol/tobacco/depression; different approach than usual. Emergency response team – county, police, and Agnesian are talking, bigger work to focus on. Resource guide – working on having it available on the Living Well website. Marian Sheridan shared status of grant – officially submitted grant application, partnership with medical college, it is intended to increase overall framework of mental health in the community, works on early identification (grant = \$200,000 over 2 years, and if granted that grant, could be eligible for larger grant = \$750,000 over 5 years.)</p>	<p>Continuing implementation</p>	<p>Matt Doll</p>
<p><b>Obesity and Overweight</b></p>	<p>Greg Giles and Sandi Roehrig reported: on excited news from the Living Well Committee. Discussion was focused on the “Loop” for Fond du Lac County. The “loop” is a bike trail in other states and would be a good possibility in Fond du Lac. Fond du Lac has a trail already consisting of 15.4 miles that could become the loop.
